

OCEANIA TOUR 2022

The Oceania Tour 2022 will comprise of 5 tournaments as listed above

The points calculations for the tour will be directly from the BWF World Rankings in all five disciplines: MS, WS, MD, WD, XD for each tournament

Following the last tournament; SATHIO GROUP Australian Open, the winner of each event will be announced; no later than 24 November 2022

Points for doubles are calculated per pair as per the BWF World Ranking List. Both players in a doubles pair must meet the eligibility criteria

The Tour rankings will show on the Badminton Oceania website: badmintonoceania.org/Oceania-Tour

The aim of creating the Tour is to both provide an additional incentive to players to support tournaments in the region and to be able to provide the best players in the region with some additional financial support to attend international tournaments or training camps with the long-term aim performing to a high level in events of importance, ie. Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games, World Championships, Thomas & Uber Cup, Sudirman Cup, World Junior Championships

Eligibility

Players must meet BWF criteria to play Oceania Championships 2022 to be eligible to be a part of the Oceania Tour 2022

Players/pairs must play a minimum of 3 tournaments to be eligible for a final Tour ranking.

Tour Winners

The Oceania Tour winners in each discipline will be announced no later than 24 November 2022

The winners to receive training/competition scholarships according to the amounts as below; paid to their MA for distribution and acquittal following implementation of the activity the scholarship is covering

Singles Winners – NZ\$1,500 each
Doubles Winners – NZ\$2,500 per pair

Players to submit a plan for the use of scholarship funds by 20 December 2022 to their MA and BOC Once agreed by BOC the MA to forward payment to the players
Reporting and acquittal of the funds to be made no later than 10 July 2023

If a player/pair does not submit a plan by 20 December 2022, the funds to be returned to BOC.

In doubles events the pair must complete the same training/competition to spend the funds as a pair, ie. they must do the same project at the same time.

<u>Updated 15 July 2022</u>: The Oceania Tour 2022 originally comprised of 7 tournaments. However, the New Zealand Open and Manawatu International were cancelled – <u>read media update here</u>. The prize money was adjusted from \$2,000 to \$1,500 for singles; from \$3,500 to \$2,500 per doubles pair.
